

MARS Team Completes Cycling Time Trial Support

September 30th marked the last Carolina Cycling Time Trial Association (CCTTA) event of the year. Like last year, the MARS club provided track marshals to assist in the enforcement of the time trial rules and to improve emergency team response time in the case of an accident.





The MARS team is trained to watch for violations such as drafting (following too close for too long a time), blocking (preventing a rider from passing another) and passing on the left (slower riders must stay left). CCTTA officials regularly get e-mails from riders indicating the CCTTA time trials are the most professional like amateur events they have ever attended. Much of this is due to the presence of the uniformed marshals from MARS. (Each marshal wears a black/white stripped shirt).

Last year, MARS and CCTTA had an agreement to provide the support for a donation of \$100 per event. At the end of last year CCTTA presented a check for \$1000 to MARS for their support of the 9 events. This year, although no formal agreement was signed, however the same relationship was established at the last event, and CCTTA again donated \$1000 to MARS for their sup-

port even though there were only six events!



This income is due to the volunteer support of all those who assisted the event coordinators for the year. Mary Hunt – N4MH, Jeff Blythe – KA4WYC and Earl Fortner – K4KAY took turns insuring we had five volunteers show up for each of the events.

Let's Go Racing!

On Februaruy 6th there is a Rally auto race in Cheraw South Carolina, and we need your help.

Two of the participants of the rally are driver Brad Morris WB4MMG, and his crew chief Mitch Barbato KM4AMB. They are also both new members of MARS.

The National Auto Sports Association (NASA) sanctions rally races, and this race is part of the Atlantic Rally Championship (ARC.) Races in the ARC are held all over the East Coast including South Carolina, Maine, Florida, Tennessee, New York, and West Virginia.

We are expecting 40 to 70 competitors at the rally. Last year this was the largest rally in North America with many former and current national champions in attendance.



Volunteers with Ham radio licenses are the heart of the rally's operations. Volunteers will help coordinate the start and finish of the race stages, work as course marshals, and ensure the safe operation of the rally. In an emergency, the hams will coordinate the safety crews and traffic.
