MARS 60th Anniversary Special Event Station


We will be holding a two-week "on-air" celebration of the anniversary of the founding of the **Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society** from **March 7th through 21st.**, including a portable station operating at the 2009 Charlotte Hamfest.

On March 25th, 1949 the Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society was founded and chartered in Charlotte, North Carolina. This March marks the 60th anniversary of MARS' founding. Over the past year, discussions took place about how to celebrate this important event. The idea of getting a 'special event' callsign and sharing our 'anniversary' with hams worldwide became the top choice. So, the call W4B was obtained for MARS to use during the period of March 7th through the 21st. This time window was picked to overlap with the 2009 Charlotte Hamfest because the idea of having a station set up and operating at the Hamfest also sounded like a great way share our birthday with our friends and visitors.

Many hams around the world actively listen for and work special event stations so they can receive the QSL cards or certificates of the special event. Since our current W4BFB club call QSL cards are running low, we decided to try to get a new QSL card that might be used for our W4B special event as well as for everyday W4BFB QSOs. After some considerable design work, here is the 'new' W4BFB/W4B card:



In tribute to our club founders, their 13 names are listed on the reverse side of our new QSL card.



Special Event Station (cont.)

The front side is high gloss 'postcard' printing, and the back is a grayscale matte. The printing is sharp and clear on the actual card; these images have been scanned and compressed for sending over the internet.

Beginning on March 7th 0000Z, and running through the 21st 2359Z, we can operate our club station on all authorized bands and sign the call W4B. We can tell the folks who work us that W4B is a special event call, celebrating the 60th anniversary of the founding of the Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society. Every 30 minutes or so you need to add that you are using the call W4B on behalf of W4BFB, so our regular call is given. There will be some 'cheat sheets' you can use to 'work the bands' if you want. The main idea is to have some fun and make contacts all around the US and the world. BUT, we have to keep good logs of all the contacts. This is to keep track of who worked us, so we can know who is honestly asking us for our QSL card.

We hope to operate W4B using all ham modes, PHONE, CW, PSK, RTTY, FM, HF, VHF, UHF, etc. We are looking for members who would be willing to come to the clubroom to operate the station during this period. Operation can be whenever it is convenient for the operators. The important thing is that the control operator be licensed for the bands and modes used during the operation and must keep a log of all the contacts. On Thursday March 12th, the Jupiter, its power supply, and the antenna autotuner will be removed from the clubroom to be relocated at the 2009 Charlotte Hamfest, where we plan to operate the station on 20m during the Hamfest. We need some operators who would like to operate W4B during one to two hour shifts during the Hamfest. Hamfest operation will be mostly PHONE, but a CW key will be available if wanted.

If you would like to operate W4B, at the clubroom or at the Hamfest, send a note to Ben Antanaitis, WB2RHM mailto:wB2RHM@W4BFB.org He will coordinate the W4B operations and try to 'match' control operators with folks who need a higher class 'partner' for their W4B operation.

January and February Meetings

Our featured presenter for January was Steve Kiser from WCNC TV36. Steve is the director of technology at WCNC. He gave a presentation about Channel 36's transition to digital television (DTV). Steve stated that channel 36 has been testing and using DTV since November 1999. Steve gave a PowerPoint presentation of the arrival of DTV. He showed several models of converters you can use if you don't have cable or satellite TV already. He stated the funds the government had set out to offset cost of the boxes had been mostly used up. So if you want to have 'over the air' reception after the cut over date, (which is now June 12th) you would need to buy a converter box now, and be reimbursed when more funds become available. Steve went over what type of antennas would work. You could spend lots of money or next to nothing for an antenna. If you have a vhf/uhf antenna from say the 70's, it would still be ok to use for the digital converter box. You may even be able to use a 'set top' antenna like the old rabbit ears. Some of the amplified 'set top' models have remarkable performance. One of the reasons Steve came to our meeting was to seek help from technical groups like amateur radio to help our friends and neighbors who are having trouble setting up their converter boxes. So seek out those not as smart at hooking up wires to receivers as we are! Thanks Steve for a great presentation!

For the February meeting, Dick Williams (W3OA) will give a presentation on CW Skimmer. This program allows you to decode CW signals using your computer and its sound card. This should be a very interesting presentation.
