A Letter from the President

News from the President – January 2010

Hello Everyone,

Here's hoping that 2010 has started off to be a great year for you and yours.



On January 5th, the new MARS Board and Officers got together for the first time. We welcomed new MARS Board members Barry -KC4SSS and Bill - K4AHK, and also Andy - K4GKK to his new job as MARS Secretary. Then, we held our annual 'planning and organization' meeting. This is when we try to look at what club activities and events will and might be coming up during the new year (Gosh, there are a lot of them!) Then we see who might want to help/lead the efforts needed to make them all happen. Some of our club committees are required by the MARS' By-Laws, and others the President and the Board create when we find out what needs to be done to make our club run OK. We looked at what we think the club wants to do and the things that the club has to do. When we were done, we found out that we really need more club members to join all the committees, and that there are a couple of committees that need someone to lead them up as chairperson. This is a great opportunity for you to be an active part of the club, by making a personal contribution of a small amount of time. This will go a long way in keeping MARS-2010 smoothly running and active. Tom – KA3VVJ, Andy – K4GKK, Bill - K4AHK, and Ben – WB2RHM are working to complete the job of having a complete 2010 MARS membership roster put together as soon as possible. All of the information from the 2010 Renewal form is needed to update the MARS membership database kept and used by the MARS Secretary. The Secretary's database is how we keep and maintain the required club records, keep the reflector membership and email address lists accurate (so you can receive notices and announcements via email), and be able to contact you if there is club business or emergency need. Second, we will use only your name, callsign, and a hyperlink to your QRZ.com listing (all public information), on the Club 2010 Roster page on our web site, just like it is today. And third, and this is the new part, we will create a paper printed-only MARS membership roster with callsign, name, address, license class, email address (only with your permission), phone number (only with your permission). The printed roster will be available only to MARS members and only if requested. The *most important part* of this effort *needs you* to renew your MARS membership, using the new MARS Renewal Form, as soon as possible, if you haven't done it yet. 
I want to say Thanks to everyone who supports the Club and me by coming to our club meetings and helping with our events and projects. I want to see our Club continue to grow and prosper.

MARS - 2010 Membership Renewal Campaign



2010 marks the first time that all MARS members need to renew their annual membership at the start of the calendar year. We used to have the membership renew at the end of June and the beginning of July, but that was changed a year and a half ago by the MARS Board of Directors to make it easier to remember when renewal time was.

We began our renewal campaign in October and the renewal rate has progressed steadily since then. Currently (1/13/10), we have about 101 renewals of members in the 2009 member database. And that is *GREAT!* But we are still about 30% off the mark to get a 100% renewal success. 


And one important non-Hamfest item:

When was the last time you checked YOUR tower bolts?

A Cautionary tale from Bill Heybruck-WA2EDN

My tower was a deal. Twenty years ago when HUGO hit the area and took with it a number of ham radio towers. I found my tower. One of my regular morning travel radio companions was Bob-KB4QR. He had a nice 50 foot Universal Aluminum tower with a Tailtwister Rotator and a couple of nice beams. When Hugo went through his neighborhood it twisted the top 10 feet off his tower and set the top section and remaining twisted aluminum of the antennas in his back yard. Fortunately he was well insured and it was not long before he had a new 50 foot tower installed and new antennas and rotator positioned on the tower. I happened to ask him what happened to the old tower and he told me that it was in a scrap pile at one of his friend's shops. I went to the pile and there it was, so I loaded my truck with the lower 30 feet. I asked Bob what happened to the top section and he said that was for sale with the old rotator, so I bought it from him. A couple of months later I had the concrete poured (3x3x6 ft deep) and put the tower together with all new grade 8 bolts. I had taken the twisted top, with the rotator plate and rotor in it, and overlapped it to the top of the standing tower using 3 U bolts. See picture below.




Last March, Earl-K4KAY, found a deal on a nice TH7-DX beam. When he told me about it I said he should buy it for his tower. Later that day he decided that he was concerned it was too big for his setup so I offered to buy the beam for my tower and sell him my Explorer 14 for his tower. We both ended up with new antennas (to us) and all I had to do was put the beam together and get it on my tower. It took me a few months to get the missing hardware for the beam, assemble it and get it ready for the tower. Thanks to Earl and a few other hams, we planned to lower my tower, remove the Explorer 14 and put the TH7 on it. This made it a great time to finally get rid of that overlapped section so I ordered a pair of rotator plates for the larger section and picked up a new 8 foot aluminum mast and thrust bearing. One plate would be for the rotator and the other for the thrust bearing.

The day of reckoning came and Earl volunteered to remove the 4 base tower bolts so we could tilt it over till the back of the beam contacted the ground.

It was then that he took two of the bolts out and asked me to check them out. I was really surprised (check out the picture on the next page.) Even though the ends of the tower were clear, and water could have drained out, the bolts were not in good shape. The center of the bolts were severely eroded. We completed the work for the day and the tower went back up using the old bolts for a short term.

The next day I ordered new stainless steel bolts, and in a few days they arrived, and I swapped out all 6 grade 8 bolts with the new SS bolts. See the picture below.

It took almost 20 years to corrode those bolts that badly. I think the new ones will last that long and more.



How long has it been since you checked your bolts? Maybe it's about time.

Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society Minutes for Board Meeting of January 5th 2010.

1- The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm.

- 2- Minutes for the Board Meeting of December 3rd 2009 were accepted as presented in the December newsletter.
- 3- Treasurer's Report: Tom presented the accounts report. This was accepted by the Board. Tom mentioned that the newly elected officers have to provide signatures to a local branch of the club's bank, per the club's articles.
- 4- Vice President's report: Bill has set up the club Auction for the January meeting. Jerry Malin-N2HV will act as auctioneer, Tom and Andy will record the winning bids.
- 5- Secretary's report: Nothing to report membership-wise this month. The roster is currently being updated and set up in the club's laptop computer.

Committee Reports:

<u>Membership Committee</u>: This will be headed up this year by Bill Harding-K4AHK. Bill will be calling those members from 2009 that have not yet renewed their subscription. A note to all current members: the Board intends to change the clubroom access code at the next Board Meeting.

Repeater Committee: Earl Fortner-K4KAY has volunteered to head up this committee. Jeff Blythe-KA4WYC, Brian Mulder-KF4VOO and Bill Newsome-AC4ZR have been working on getting the Clover packet Node up and running. Tim Slay-N4IB is trying to re-establish the Packet Node on the downtown Duke Energy building.

<u>Public Service Committee</u>: Mary Hunt-N4MH will again head this committee. She will publish a calendar of events in each newsletter. This will help prospective volunteers plan ahead. Mary will act as the main liaison between the club and the MS society. We have at least three major events with the MS society each year, culminating in the Bike ride to the beach in late September. The club also helps with the Lungstrong event in October, and we have been asked to participate in marshalling a car rally in Cheraw, SC this coming February.

<u>Equipment Committee</u>: This was headed up by Andy last year. A new Chairman is requested. There are a lot of issues that need to be discussed and sorted out including Ideas about what to do with the equipment we have, where to store equipment that is not currently being used, and what equipment can we cull from our inventory. These are but a few of the topics that need to be addressed.

<u>Grants and Resources</u>: This committee will be headed up by Kevin –K4YYD. Kevin has set up a relationship between the club and Food Lion whereby we receive a small donation from Food Lion, the amount of the donation is dependent upon the amount spent by the members of the club who shops at Food Lion and uses their MVP card. New Business:

- 2- John White-WB2NHQ attended the meeting with a few subjects to go over.
 - A). The Charlotte Fire Dept has a communications team whose members have gained their Technician licenses. They are interested in gaining the General license and are hoping the club can help out with classes.
 - B). The CFD communications team requires training on setting up its antenna trailer. John has requested help with both volunteers and some of the club equipment to show how it's set up.
 - C). John is conducting a safety class for the Red Cross and has requested the use of the club's projector and screen.
 - D) A discussion was held about the prospects of returning to Discovery Place to set up the N4DP exhibition station. The conclusion was that we would not be allowed to return to the site. The equipment and furniture is currently being stored in a climate controlled storage unit. A decision was made to sell the furniture and some accessories at the Charlotte Hamfest, and find a smaller storage unit to store the remainder of the equipment. Discussion was also had about using some of the surplus equipment to set up a portable Emergency/Educational unit. This would be shown and operated for the Scouts, Girl Scouts, Schools, Civic Organizations, emergency drills, etc.
