Public Service Committee News from Mary Hunt-N4MH, Chairperson

As I am writing this article we had several hams participate this weekend in the Red Cross Cycling Event up at Lake Norman. This is the first time the Red Cross has used our communication services. We had ham radio operators at each rest stop and a Net Control at the Start/Finish Line. John White- WB2NHQ spearheaded this Public Service Event and was Net Control. I don't have the list of everyone who volunteered for the event but a special thank you to everyone who helped out. We will list the names in the next newsletter.

September 25-26, 2010

It is BREAK AWAY TO THE BEACH cycling event. For 2010 we are returning to a two day destination ride to the beach. Our final destination is Sunset Beach – not a high school near the beach BUT THE BEACH. Currently we have 1400 cyclists registered for the event and MS expects that number to increase.

I am a member of the MS Bike Tour Committee and meet monthly with the other members at the Multiple Sclerosis Society. The route committee has pretty much finalized the route and is now working on rest stops.

On Day #1 we will have three start sites:

Start Site #1 - Monroe, NC for the Century Route

Start Site #2 - Pageland, SC for the 75 mile route

Start Site #3 – Camden, SC

The Monroe route will join the Pageland route and they become one at that point. The Camden, SC route will join up in Hartsville, SC at the lunch rest stop. From Hartsville to Florence, SC everyone will be on the same route.

I am excited to announce that the Columbia Amateur Radio Club is going to support the route from Camden to Hartsville. We will use linked repeaters for this route that are part of the SC Heart group. From Monroe to Hartsville we will use linked repeaters that are part of the PALS Network.

On Day #2 we will have two start sites:

Start Site #1 – Francis Marion College in Florence, SC for 75 mile route

Start Site #2 – Lunch Rest Stop for 50 mile route

From Hartsville to Florence and on Sunday to Sunset Beach we will use the SC Heart linked repeaters.

We have determined the positions needed for the event and Elena has updated the <u>www.ridemaps.com</u> website so you can sign up for the event. All of the repeaters that will be used for the event are also on the web site. Thank you Elena!!!!

Gene Ribas-N4UMI has agreed to be Net Control on the Monroe/Pageland portion on Saturday and for the rest of the weekend. The Camden route will have their own Net Control and a separate frequency until all cyclists are in to the lunch rest stop. We will then all be on the same repeater for the rest of Saturday and all day Sunday.

There is no overnight at Francis Marion College so even the cyclists will be staying at the hotels. I suggest making your reservations early and MS has negotiated some great rates!!!

Field Day 2010, A Recap

Field Day 2010 was once again held at Wilgrove Park located on Jim Harper Rd. in Mint Hill. The size of the park provided plenty of room to spread out the HF phone, GOTA and CW stations. We had about 25 people participating as operators, loggers or in equipment set-up and take-down. Operators began making contacts at 1400 Saturday and continued until 1400 Sunday. All stations operated on emergency power supplied by two gasoline generators. We logged 410 QSOs at the Phone + CW stations. We contacted 4 countries outside of the US. We worked 47 states; 3 on 80m, 27 on 40m, 46 on 20m, and 25 on 15m. There were 84 CW QSOs and 326 Phone QSOs. Also, a total of 23 contacts were made on the GOTA stations.

Speaking of generators, the club's trusty 5Kw generator which has seen quite a few Field Days and other events, proved to be problematic during Friday afternoon's set-up. However, thanks to the generosity of Don-KJ4ATJ and Shelley Eaves-KJ4ATK who allowed the club to use their personal generator, we were able to set-up and operate the HF phone station while Ben Antanaitis - WB2RHM and Mitch Barbato -KM4AMB rebuilt the carburetor of the club's generator. Thank you Ben and Mitch for your hours of hard work...the generator runs great now!

Gremlins also made an appearance at the digital station. Thanks again to Ben who spent a lot of time trying to get the station operational and to Shawn Goodin -K4RSG for the use of his laptop.

All in all it was a very successful Field Day. Our site was visited by Greg Hauser -W3FIE with Charlotte Fire Department Field Communications who brought out the city's communications vehicle to show off. Paul Robinette-KD4OZI with NC ARES Western Branch and Tim Slay-N4IB, former ARRL Section Manager, also stopped by. We once again had a well attended cookout with burgers and hot dogs Saturday prior to operating.

1- Meeting was called to order at 7.30 pm. Attendees included: Jodie Rowland-KI4CXO, Ben Antanitis-WB2RHM, Tom Hunt- KA3VVJ, Bill Fisher-W4GRW, Kevin Keyes-K4YYD, Bill Harding-K4AHK, and Andy Hawkins-K4GKK. Absent: Mary Hunt-N4MH, Barry May KC4SSS

- 2- Minutes for the Board Meeting of June 1st, 2010 were accepted as presented in the June newsletter.
- 3- Treasurer's Report: Tom presented the accounts report. This was accepted by the Board. Tom has also closed our CD and moved all monies into a savings account.
- 4- Vice Presidents report: Bill Fisher-W4GRW. July program will be on Railroad Communications. The August meeting will be headlined by the folks from the MS Society, discussing the upcoming September Bike Ride.
- 5- Secretary's report: Nothing to report membership-wise this month. The roster and club Data have been updated and set up in the club's laptop computer. We are receiving a slow but steady flow of renewals. We are currently at 143 members for 2010.

Committee Reports:

Membership Committee: Please see secretary's report above.

Repeater Committee: W4BFB BBS upgrade is still in process. The 146.535 Skywarn repeater is temporarily off the air, The W4BFB 146.523 repeater is acting as back-up.

<u>Public Service Committee</u>: Mary Hunt-N4MH is again heading this committee, and she is publishing a calendar of events in each newsletter, to help prospective volunteers plan ahead. Mary will act as the main liaison between the club and the MS society. The MS Bike Ride on Sept. 25th-26th will be our next major public service event. The new route has been decided with starts at Pageland, Camden and Monroe. Sign Up will be handled at "Ride-Maps.com". The club also helps with the Lungstrong event in October.

Equipment Committee:

A discussion was presented on the use of the ex-Discovery place equipment and fittings. We are currently spending a monthly storage fee to keep the equipment safe. This is whittling away at the discovery place account. A thought is to purchase a Cargo style trailer and equip it as a communications trailer, this could be used for various activities, i.e. disaster communications, teaching aide for Geek fest at CPCC, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts etc. The unit could be used at field day and on our public service events. These are just a few of the ideas we have. Any ideas or comments from the membership would be welcome. This idea is still being developed.

New Technician (element 2) exams to be used.

The **Mecklenburg VE Team** will be conducting an Exam Session for all classes of FCC Amateur Radio License on Saturday August 21st beginning at 9AM at the East Baptist church 6850 Monroe Road Charlotte, NC (East Baptist Church is located next to East Mecklenburg HS, near the intersection of Monroe Rd and Conference Drive)

Notice: As of July 1st, 2010, a new Element 2 (Technician Class) question pool is in effect. The questions and answers are different from the prior pool and there are now Diagram (schematic) based questions in the new pool. If you have been studying the old element 2 pool questions, be prepared see different questions and answers.

All applicants are requested to arrive by 8:30AM, to complete the registration process before testing begins at 9:00AM. They must bring a photo ID (drivers license OK), their current original amateur license, **ONE COPY** of their current amateur license, to be submitted along with their exam, an original and a copy of any current CSCEs, plus the 2010 WCARS/VEC testing fee of \$10.00.

Walk-ins examinees are welcome, but we would appreciate it if you register in advance by sending an email to Mecklen-burgVETeam@W4BFB.org Call 704-948-7373 if you need additional information.

Any special testing needs, ie verbal exams, translators, etc. must be pre-requested at least two full weeks before the testing date. (NOTE: While it will try to accommodate the needs of any applicant, the Mecklenburg VE Team, as an all-volunteer staffed VE Team, cannot guarantee that special need requests can be honored at all testing sessions.)
