We even might be able to do the practice over Echolink or perhaps get permission from ARRL to send their code practice there also. Not everyone has an HF transceiver to listen with but today most have a computer and can get on the internet.

Also, do we need to have a technician class? They are thinking about one at Discovery Place but this would probably be in the daytime and not easily attended by folks who work. Let's hear what you have to say!

Saturday June 26th and ends Sunday June 27th. Again, this year, our site is at Mint Hill Park. See directions and map to the Park elsewhere on this page.

All club members are welcome and are needed. It is the best place to learn how to assemble beam antennas and rotors, string dipoles, raise towers and much more. Its also an excellent place to jaw with other members about your experiences in Ham Radio.

And of course we need operators. There will be three stations. A SSB phone station, a digital station (see/learn/operate RTTY or PSK-31) and a CW station. Both experienced and inexperienced ops are welcome at all stations.

When you arrive, go to the station(s) where you want to operate and place your name on the clipboard to be found there.

If you are a technician you can operate at any of the three stations as long as a control operator is there. If your friend who is thinking about getting a ham license comes along he/.she can also operate with the presence of a control operator.

We need experienced operators also. If CW is your thing, bring your favorite key with you or use the paddles we have.

In addition to operators we need loggers. The logger uses a laptop computer to record all the contacts. If you want to watch an experienced op for a while maybe you could log his contacts then take over after you feel more comfortable about operating.

Please bring a lawn or other chair with you. There will be some food and drinks on hand but you might want to bring your own lunch-dinner-drinks.

Directions to Mint Hill Park


Via Albemarle Road

Heading away from town on Albemarle Road, go past the Walmart (on your left) at Harrisburg Road. At the next traffic light (approx. 1 mile), turn right onto Wilgrove-Mint Hill Road. Go 1.6 miles and then turn right onto Jim Harper Lane (the sign for the park is slightly set back from the intersection). You have missed the turn if you reach the traffic light at NC 51.

Via I-485

Take the Mint Hill (NC 218) exit and turn toward Mint Hill. Go past "Mint Hill Park on Fairview" -- that is the wrong park. Go approximately 1.8 miles and turn left onto Jim Harper Lane (the sign for the park is slightly set back from the intersection). You have missed the turn if you cross Truelight Church Road.
