From the Editor

The QRZ article sent out by Dave Wentzel by email got me to thinking that we need to do much more than we are doing today to strengthen and grow our hobby. Several immediately viable and reasonable options occurred to me.

The first is to invite young people into our hobby more aggressively than we are today. High Schools offer opportunities for students to join clubs – why not a HAM club? Let's face it; we are aging at a pretty fast pace. According to the article "It is estimated that the median age of AR is 58 - 60 years old." We need to bring our median age to the 20's and 30's, and one way is to introduce our youth to Ham Radio and spark their interest in the hobby. We need to initiate HAM clubs in our high schools, even our middle schools, and invite them into MARS – a youth version of MARS – more hands on, more projects, before our MARS meeting then let them stay for our "oldster" version if they desire, and visa versa.

We also need more adults in the hobby. But people join what they know about - what sparks their interest: but they need to hear about what we do and who we are. We need much more visibility. When we are involved in service events, we should view them not only as a way to serve our communities, but as opportunities to also disseminate information about Ham Radio. A simple Press Release covering basic facts sent to newspapers, radio and TV stations will aid us in this endeavor, if done correctly Press releases must be short, concise, and direct to the topic not a long winded history of the hobby, the club and everything else in between. Three short paragraphs. Like most editors, newspaper editors have short attention spans.

If you have a contact with anyone in the news media – let one of the officers know. Perhaps it's the key we need!

PRESIDENT'S LETTER

First of all, thanks and welcome to Sue Goodin, K9SUE for taking over our newsletter after the untimely passing of W4NCU. This first issue is usually the most difficult, but we should be ok for next month.

On Friday, Saturday, and Sunday June 3-5, 2005, we assisted the National MS Society Mid-Atlantic Chapter with the 5th Annual MS Challenge Walk. 162 walkers raised an average of \$2,100 each by walking 50 miles over three days from Pfeiffer University in Misenheimer, NC to Lowe's Motor Speedway in Concord. Members of the Cabarrus Amateur Radio Society assisted us during this activity and also provided the use of their 146.655 repeater for the event on Saturday and Sunday. Thanks to the following amateurs for their assistance – we could not have done this without them! N4MH, KA3VVJ, N4WIK, WB2NHQ, K4RSG, K9SUE, KA4ATT, W4LN, WA4BRL, AE4AT, KI4KFS, and W4JDR. Thanks!

It's not too early to begin thinking about the MS-150, our biggest public service event of the year. It's a 150 mile bicycle ride from Rockingham and Weddington to North Myrtle Beach, and it

happens every year, rain or shine or hurricanes. Be sure to consider whether you need motel reservations, and please remember that there will be some route changes this year (overnight will be in Darlington and not Florence). This is a fun event but we really need lots of help from everyone to make it a success. Amateurs will be needed for rest stops, situation teams, and as SAG vehicles during the event. This is the 20th anniversary of the event, September 24 and 25, 2005.

We will be voting on the budget for 2005-2006 at the June meeting. Since the Hamfest income was up a bit, we do not expect many changes in our operating budget compared to last year.

Earl Fortner, K4KAY now has a 900 MHz repeater up on 927.6125 MHz (-25 MHz), with a PL of 118.8. If you are interested in 900 MHz, the Club has a mailing list where you can exchange 900 MHz information with other list members. 

The meeting was called to order at 7:07PM.



As of June 10th, there are only 11 folks signed up for the SetUp/TakeDown teams. Because of this, the SetUp effort will be split into two parts.

Weather permitting; the first part of SetUp will be on Friday June 24th, during mid afternoon. A start time of 3 PM to 4 PM is the target. We will be monitoring the 146.94 and 444.350 repeaters, so they can be used to check on actual status of the effort.

We need to:

 Pitch the two tents. In addition to the dome tent, we have a new cabin tent for the Phone station this year.





- Place and open the RV.
- Place the generator trailer.

 Safely assemble, erect, and guy the aluminum tower equipped with rotators, tri-band beams, standoffs to support wire dipoles, the wire dipoles, rotor control cables, rotor controllers, antenna coaxes.



On Saturday morning, June 25th, at 9 AM, SetUp will continue with:

- Safely assemble, erect, and guy the steel tower equipped with rotators, triband beams, standoffs to support wire dipoles, the wire dipoles, rotor control cables, rotor controllers, antenna coaxes.
- Run power cables from generator, set up portable generator.
- Setup Radios in the Phone, CW and Digital stations.
- Setup WiFi Lan, linking the station's computer log.
- Setup for the MARS FD 55 Public Information area.
- Make preparations for the Setup crew after setup picnic.

At 2 PM, operate and demonstrate our communications skills for 24 hours, until 2 PM Sunday. The current plan has opportunities for Phone, CW, and Digital modes (RTTY/PSK) of operation. There are 10 folks signed up to operate stations for periods during the weekend. There are many hours without operators signed up. We hope to have all stations active in all modes for the entire Field Day operation period. The Phone and CW stations will be able to switch modes to accommodate available operators. In addition to 'operators', we need 'loggers' for the stations. We also want to have a VHF-FM station in the Public Information Area for visitors to talk on the ham radio. Tours of the site, to compliment visits from the general public, public officials and served agency representatives will be held as required.

On Sunday afternoon, we take it all down and pack it all up.

That's probably not all that needs to be done for Field Day but you can see we need lots of help. Experienced help is critical, but anyone who wants to help will be more than welcome.
