

News from the President - March 2010

Hello Everyone,

It is the middle of March and March Madness arrived again.... No, I'm not talking about basketball; I'm talking about the annual Charlotte Hamfest .



Hamfest weekend starts out just like in all the past years. A work crew gathers early in the morning on the day before the Hamfest, to begin setting up all the Flea Market tables so they match the pattern in our approved floor plans. As the Flea Market area takes shape, some of the commercial dealers begin setting up their booths with their banners, equipment, and goodies. Just after noontime, the Flea Market set up is done and the Flea Market dealers start to put out their treasures. That's the way it is supposed to work, but this year was different... before we even had the Flea Market set up, it was already Sold-Out! 312 tables were all pre-sold by Friday the 12th, the day before the Hamfest. So, we conferred with the folks at the Cabarrus Arena on Friday morning and got permission to add even more tables to our Flea Market. We added just over 20 additional tables to the layout. It was a good thing too, because almost all of the additional tables were sold by early Saturday morning. A Double Sell-Out in the Flea Market Area, wow! This is a good problem to have. Most of the commercial dealers we talked with said they were pleased and having steady Saturday business, with lots of visitors to their booths. Our W4BFB Club Booth saw a very brisk business, with lots of interest being shown by Hamfest visitors and dealers. All of our hourly prizes were awarded, and Richard Dodd-K4KRW won the W4BFB raffle. Bingo provided some fun and distraction on Saturday morning, lots of license exams were given, and the forums all occurred on

PUBLIC SERVICE EVENTS

Public Service Committee News from Mary Hunt-N4MH, Chairperson (Reprinted from last month's Newsletter. Just remember, that these dates are now a month closer, so please be ready to help!)

We have several public service events already scheduled for 2010.

May 15, 2010 --

Our first event for the Multiple Sclerosis Society will be the Charlotte Walk on May 15. The walk will start and end at Symphony Park by South Park Mall.

We will need volunteers for 4 or 5 rest stops, SAG Vehicles, bicycle mobiles and Director Chauffeurs. This year we are trying to use more bicycle mobiles on the route especially for the sweep vehicle as it is not as intimidating for the walkers. This event takes place in the morning and we are normally done by 12:30.

June 4-6, 2010

The MS Challenge Walk is a three day event with the walkers doing a total of 50 miles. They walk 20 miles on Friday, 20 miles on Saturday and 10 miles on Sunday. The event will be held again this year at Gaffney, SC starting/ending each day at Limestone College. We will need volunteers for 8 – 10 rest stops on Friday/Saturday and 5 on Sunday. Even if you can only volunteer for one day we will be glad for your support. For this event we are also looking to use several bicycle mobiles as well as SAG Vehicles, Medical Support vehicles and Director vehicles equipped with radio operators.

Overnight accommodations will be available at the college. And there are several area motels in Gaffney.

September 25-26, 2010

It is BREAK AWAY TO THE BEACH cycling event. For 2010 we are returning to a two day destination ride to the beach.

I am a member of the MS Bike Tour Committee and meet monthly with the other members at the Multiple Sclerosis Society. The route committee is working on finalizing the route and plans to have a final route by April. Once we get the route the process can begin to check repeaters and also see if repeaters can be linked for the event.

On day #1 we will go to Florence, SC and overnight at Francis Marion College. On Day #2 the end point will be Sunset Beach.

As soon as additional information is learned regarding the routes and rest stops I will let everyone know. We will probably have about 7 – 8 rest stops each day as well as need 8 to 10 SAG Vehicles. We will also need radio operators for Medical Support Team, and a Supply Team Leader.

- 2- Minutes for the board meeting of February 2nd 2010 were accepted as presented in the February newsletter.
- 3- Treasurer's Report: Tom presented the accounts report. This was accepted by the board. Tom also included Year to Date balance sheet and a Profit & Loss report for the current fiscal year.
