

The featured presentation "OSHA Fall Protection, or How Not to Fall On Your Head CFR-1926-502" was given by Jeff (KA4WYC). Jeff' demonstrated OSHA requirements for fall protection. He pointed out that falling is not the only danger when climbing a tower. You could instead end up strangling yourself if you don't' follow proper safety procedures and use proper equipment.

Jeff also pointed out that you should study and completely understand proper procedures before climbing a tower. Things change and you have to keep up to date. For example, standard procedure now is to use a body harness instead of a body belt. Jeff pointed out that just seeing his presentation does not constitute proper study and preparation.

Jeff also told the humorous tail of his experience of experiencing a heart attack on a water tower. Thanks Jeff for a great presentation on a very important topic.

For the September meeting, Scott (KI4FAU) will give a presentation on software for controlling radios.

Josh (W4WJF) to Participate in VK9DWX DXPedition

W4BFB member Josh Fisher (W4WJF), an Electrical Engineering honor student at NC State University, has been selected to participate in the VK9DWX DXpedition to Willis Island, Australia from October 6th-October 19th.

Even though Josh just turned 21, he isn't a stranger to DX or HF contesting. Josh was first licensed at the age of eleven and holds an Extra class license. He has operated in many



ARRL Field Days with groups such as the Shelby Amateur Radio Club (SARC), Lincoln County ARES/RACES, the Dixie Radio Pirates, and the North Carolina State University Student Amateur Radio Society. Contesting as an HF single operator station he placed #1 in the ARRL's Roanoke Division in the 2004 ARRL DX Phone contest on 20 meters. Josh is also an award winning VHF contester. He achieved three consecutive first place finishes in the CQ Worldwide VHF contest in the Two Meter single operator (SOSB) category. He has also participated in many VHF contests as a team member of the AA4ZZ limited multi-operator contest team in Boone, NC, EM96.

Josh is a member of the following organizations; the American Radio Relay League, the NC State University Student Amateur Radio Society, the Carolina DX Association, the Radio Club of America, and the Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society.

Josh is as passionate about his education as he is about ham radio and contesting. He is pursuing a dual major in Electrical Engineering and Computer Engineering. Even with these grueling curricula, he has made the dean's list every semester. His hard work has been recognized by many in the past including the American Radio Relay League Foundation and the Foundation for Amateur Radio who have awarded him several Amateur Radio related academic scholarships.

Unfortunately, his studies this summer at the University of Valencia, in Spain, prevented him from defending his CQWW VHF title this year. But, Josh clearly has his priorities right and there is always next year.

The Bavarian Contest Club of Germany recently held a world-wide competition for young hams between the ages of 18-29 "who have a passion for Ham Radio, DXing and contesting" to take part in the DXpedition to Willis Island in October of this year." After submitting an essay describing how he got started in ham radio, who his Elmer was and why he should be selected for this DXpedition opportunity, Josh was one of two hams selected from a worldwide field. The VK9DWX crew will pay for all of his expenses except his flights between Raleigh, NC and Cairns, Queensland, Australia.

Willis Island is located beyond the Great Barrier Reef in the Coral Sea some 420 km east of Cairns, Queensland, Australia. From a ham radio DX perspective, Willis Island is a highly sought after DXCC entity.

Willis Island is #15 in the World on CW needs.



Date: Saturday, October 18th, 2008

Time to meet:

All stations need to report to me, by 7:15, at the above location before going to their posts. More than likely transportation will be provided to post stations. I am estimating the entire event will take at the most 3 hours.

What to bring:

Ham Radio, hat for shade, and something to drink/eat during the event. Food and drinks will be provided at the finish line.

Duties:

The primary duties will be to provide emergency communications to the net. The net control will be provided with a list of contact numbers for different functions, such as: medical personal, SAG wagon, supplies, etc... Therefore, the net control needs to have his/her cell phone with him/her at the event.

Benefits:

Every volunteer will be provided with free food, drinks, and shirts. More than likely there will be a live band and a lot of games for the kids to be part of. Most important, there will be a ton of information about lung cancer and how it is the number one cancer killer. 85% of individuals diagnosed will pass away. This will be a great time for our club to gather for a fun filled day of eating and meeting and chatting together while our children get to play with each other at the playground.


Traveling I-85 to or from Charlotte -
