

#### The GeekFest 2016

For several vears now, the Mecklenburg Amateur Radio Society has had a live onthe-air ham

demonstration at The GeekFest. GeekFest is a one-day exposition of many examples of applied technology, gathered at the Matthews CPCC Levine Campus. This year it will take place on Thursday, November 10, 2016, from 9:00am - 4:00pm.

We plan both HF and VHF GoBoxes, a G5RV, and an Extended Double Zepp, hung from the roof top where visitors can see the simple antennas we use instead of the internet. ARES and the portability of our equipment are also an important aspect of our presentation. The people we meet include CPCC students, faculty, technology

exhibitors, and homeschool students with their parents. Because it's a GeekFest, we focus more on PSK-31, packet, and APRS, but still include some phone and maybe some CW to attract passers-by. One full time job is interpreting to visitors what they are seeing, by explaining the "how" and "why."

Our "high-tech" antenna installation is planned the Wednesday before GeekFest after lunch, and station set-up will be rolled in Thursday morning. # Calling All South Carolinians! —The Parity Act

South Carolinians, amateur radio needs your help. Please take a few minutes to read through this entire email, which will shape the future of ham radio.

The Amateur Radio Parity Act, HR1301 is now in the U.S. Senate for a vote, and that's why we need your help.

While ARRL members should have received an email asking for help, I am asking all clubs to reach out to Amateur Radio Operators (Non-ARRL or ARRL members) to click on a safe hyperlink and enter their zip code, which will automatically send letters to your state's two U.S. Senators asking for their vote for the Parity Act. If HR1301 passes the Senate, it will then go to the President for his signature and will become law.

Please help us in the effort. It takes only a few minutes. Please go to this linked website and follow the prompts: https://arrl.rallycongress.net/ctas/urge-senate-to-support-amateur-radio-parity-act

The staff and officials of the ARRL are permitted to only reach out to members; however, the use of this Rally Congress web link can be used by anyone who desires to support this legislation.

This is the first federal antenna relief measure in 31 years since the FCC issued the PRB-1 ruling. If it becomes law, the Amateur Radio Parity Act will permit licensed amateur radio operators to set up an effective outdoor antenna in neighborhoods and subdivisions with antenna restrictions. Trade industry data suggest that up to half of all hams live in home owner association (HOA) regulated housing. Furthermore, upwards of three out of four new housing units are covered by homeowner restrictions. Antenna restrictions have been an impediment to operation for many radio operators, so please take a few minutes now to generate letters to your U.S. Senators in support of HR1301.

Remember who will benefit from this legislation, in addition to those currently impacted:

- Older hams who downsize or relocate to smaller housing
- Operators who move into assisted living facilities
- Hams who move into HOA restricted neighborhoods to take care of an aging or disabled individual
- Working or military hams who are in short term housing
- Youth who get an interest in amateur radio and want to become licensed
- Emergency communicators who can provide vital neighborhood links with responders and government agencies

While you may not be currently impacted by antenna restrictions, hundreds of thousands of hams are. Unless they get a chance to get on the air, the number of licensed operators will diminish, and with that, the possible future of our hobby and public service. Every amateur radio operator needs to contact their U.S. Senators now (PLEASE!).

Thanks to the overwhelming number of amateur radio operators who contacted their U.S. House Representatives to help get HR1301 passed!

If you have questions about amateur radio club support, Special Service Clubs, Field Day or anything related to club activities or operation, please email me with your questions and I will get an answer and help from someone in the amateur radio community — if I cannot answer your question directly.

Let's contact friends through amateur radio and not a cellphone call.

MOMENTUM BUILDING TO URGE SENATE PASSAGE OF THE AMATEUR RADIO PARI-

**TY ACT –** The response to ARRL's call to action urging the support of US Senators for the Amateur Radio Parity Act, H.R. 1301, has been gratifying — although the campaign continues. More than 50,000 e-mails have been sent to Capitol Hill via Rally Congress, and all 100 US Senate members have been contacted. The League continues to encourage members of the Amateur Radio community who have not yet done so to reach out to their two US Senators seeking their support. Just where things stand with respect to the bill's future in the US Senate is not yet entirely clear. "As of this moment, we have no date set for action by the Senate," said ARRL Hudson Division Director Mike Lisenco, N2YBB, who has been deeply in-



volved in promoting passage of the legislation. "The Senate will adjourn the September work period soon and members will return home to campaign. If we do not achieve consideration before they go into hiatus, we will have to wait until they return after Election Day." Presently, the US Senate has recessed without acting upon the Amateur Radio Parity Act. But, that does not mean ARRL Members should take a break – your help is still needed! As of October 4<sup>th</sup>, more than 60,000 letters have been sent to Capitol Hill, including 997 letters from our Section that have been delivered to the offices of Senators Burr and Tillis. If you have not sent letters, please use the Rally Congress tool to contact your NC Senators – Senators Richard Burr and Thom Tillis – to request their support of HR 1301 Amateur Radio Parity Act by voting favorably for the Bill.
